

Update from our Member in Discernment

(originally written for the annual meeting of the UCC's New Haven Association)

My name is Jennifer McCleery and I have been a member-indiscernment with the New Haven Association Committee on Ministry for three years. Being a "memberin-discernment" is our denomination's process for discerning whether or not someone is called to ordained ministry. I am in the fall semester of my fourth and final year at Yale Divinity School. Currently, I am enrolled in the CPE program at Yale New Haven Hospital, which runs from the end of August until the middle of February. Additionally, I am taking two courses at YDS this semester: a required history of Christianity and a reading course a few other students and I put together to pursue our particular interest in early American Christianity in relationship to Witchcraft, Magic and the Occult. Next spring I will have one final required course, in Christian Ethics, but will take at least one other course in the area of Reformed Studies. The CPE program is on average 25-30 hours per week, so though I feel I have less time to participate in life at YDS this semester, I have been as busy as ever. I have found that much of my mental and emotional energy has gone into giving myself over to the CPE experience.

I am a member at Spring Glen Church in Hamden, am married to Mike McCleery, and have three sons, ages 16, 14 and 10. Between chauffeuring to sports, overseeing homework, and sympathizing with the vicissitudes of teenage life, my role as a mother feels just as important as when my children were younger.

I felt blessed to have spent most of June on a study program in Jerusalem. Through YDS I had won a fellowship to study in Israel, and found a program geared toward clergy interested in engaging in the dual narrative Israeli-Palestinian dialogue from a faith-based perspective. Our group of 13 (10 ordained clergy, three of us not) were from all over the world. We attended lectures, traveled throughout the country, visited holy sites and archeological digs, and engaged in rich conversations. It was a privilege to be able to be part of this program.

As I get closer to the end of my academic program and ordination requirements, I continue to engage in an ongoing discernment process. Along the way I have utilized many wonderful resources: professors, spiritual advisors, fellow seminarians and friends, ministry supervisors, and pastors. I feel more than ever a call to ordained ministry in the UCC church, though the focus of my ministry, or whether it might be a bi-vocational call, are still part of the work of my discernment. Please pray for me as I listen to hear where God's voice is calling me. Thank you.

Last January Spring Glen Church's Great Hall became a shelter for 12 homeless men and women. In opening our doors, we gained a glimpse of the beloved community God desires. Women and men who were strangers sat together, sharing: sharing a meal, talking about their day, serving one another. We played games and we stayed overnight. This act of Inn-keeping hospitality required the help of over 50 people throughout the course of the week. This would not have been possible if it weren't for the outpouring of support from our Spring Glen Church Family. The experience was transforming, not only for the homeless men and women but also for the church families who volunteered. One volunteer said: "I found the overnight very fulfilling, and stayed up the entire time. I can always sleep, but I can't always help the community... I can only imagine how wonderful it would be to have weeks of experience rather than 12 hours."

Another volunteer's words: "It was a great pleasure to participate with sheltering these soft-spoken and entirely gracious men."

We are once again one of many churches throughout the New Haven area participating to provide overnight shelter for 12 male clients from Columbus House in our Great Hall. Volunteers are needed for the following: to provide, serve, and share meals with guests; to share after dinner activities such as games, movies, and conversation; and (what is most needed) to stay overnight.

Notes on the Church's Finances

In place of the somewhat more detailed financial report that has appeared in the Springboard the past many years, the Trustees and I have decided that it is more appropriate and more in keeping with the spirit of the newsletter to provide in narrative form a brief update. Please know that anyone wishing more information will find the latest Treasurer's Report posted on the committee bulletin board with the minutes from the most recent meeting of the Trustees. Anyone with specific questions or concerns is invited to contact Ron Offutt, Senior Trustee, or me, Doug Hawthorne, Treasurer. Our goal is complete transparency without burdening members and friends with more information than they desire ... or making the Springboard any longer than it already is. October was another very good month for the church financially. Chuck Paul sent out pledge reminders in September, and that action resulted in overall income for the operating budget that exceeded expenditures by \$13,600. As of the end of

October our operating fund has a positive balance for the year of just over \$58,000. To put this into perspective, if we had had the full staff we currently have for the entire year through October, the operating fund balance would be close to \$0 (i.e., income would just about equal expenses). The end of October balances in the church's combined non-endowment accounts total \$205,000--\$75,000 higher than at the same point last year.

As of the end of September (statements on our endowed funds are always one month behind), the endowed funds (Ministry and Building) are almost exactly where they stood at the beginning of the year, which means they have essentially recovered the amounts taken out of them according to our "spending rule" for current use. Therefore, based on the September 30 balances, the amounts that can be transferred in 2017 will be approximately the same as the amounts transferred this year (2016).
